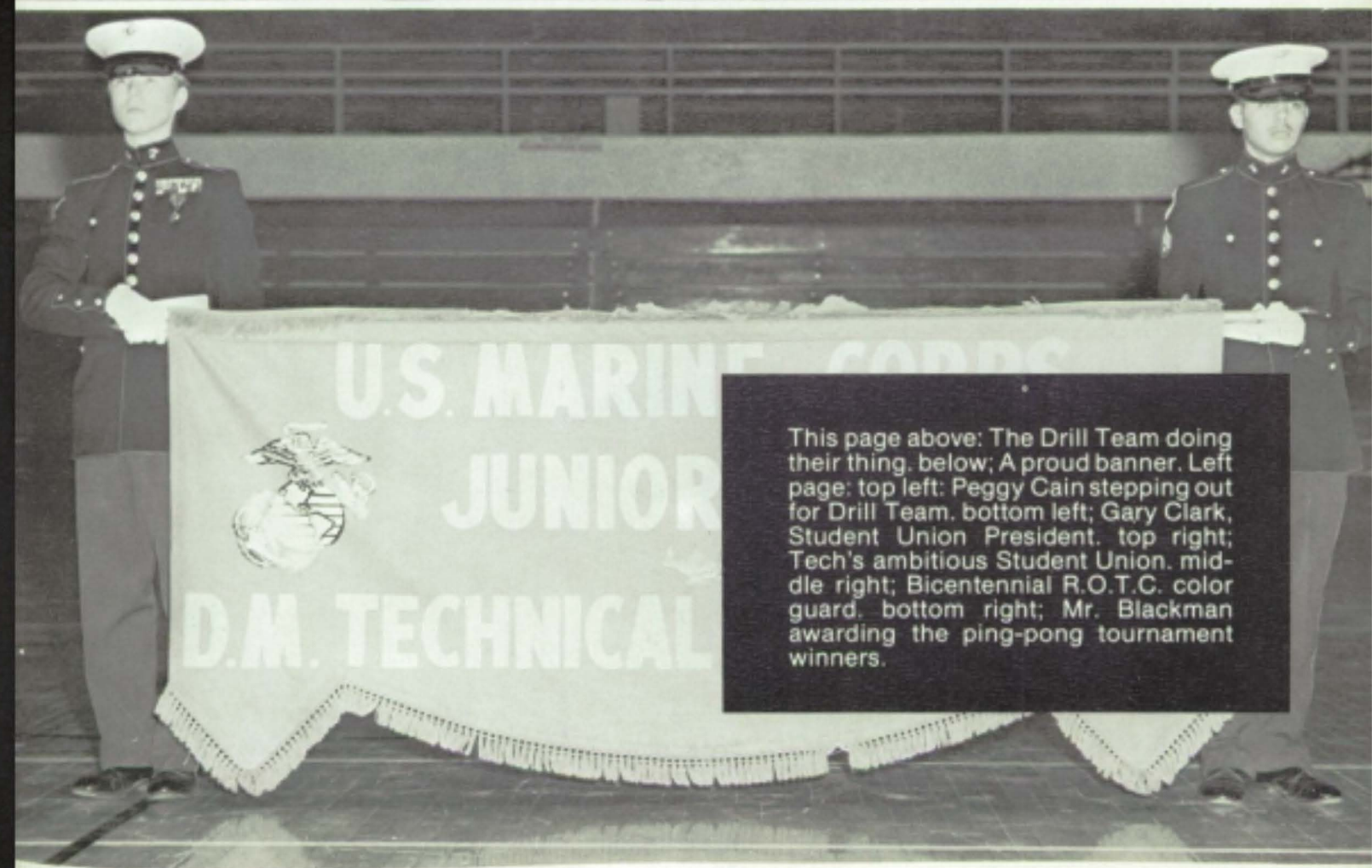
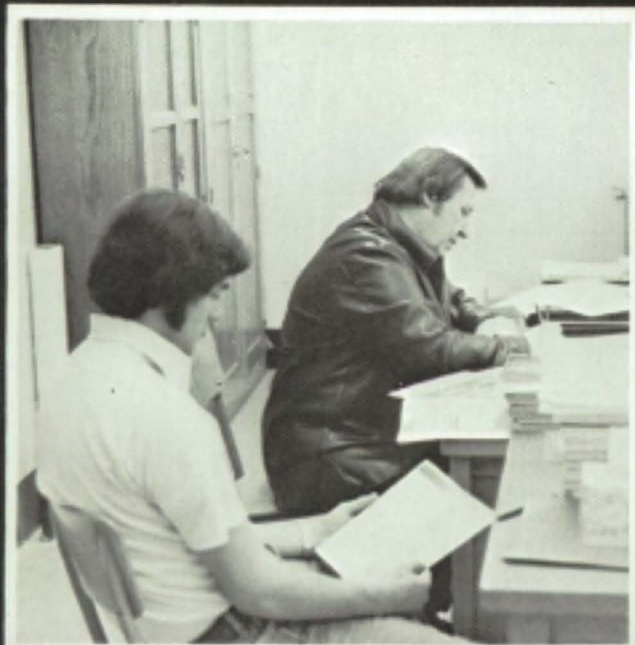
High school is probably one of the most memorable experiences of our lives. This is where we meet friends, experience new things, and set a few values which will no doubt make a big impression on our lives to follow.

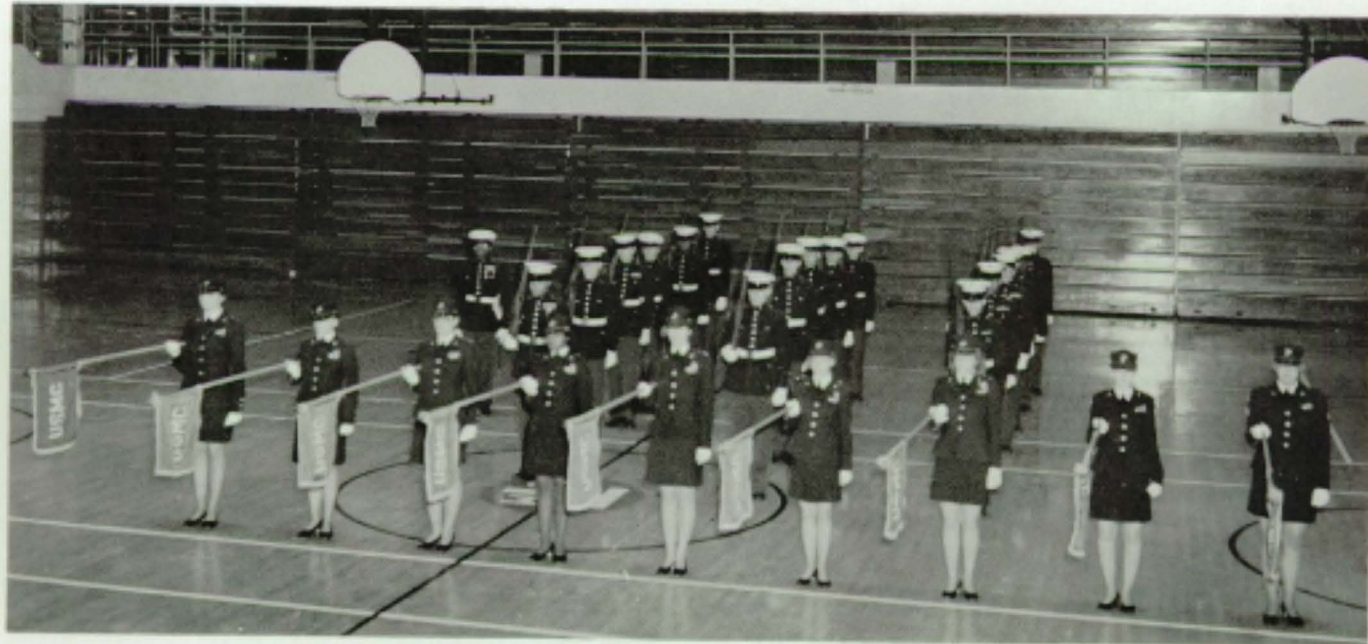

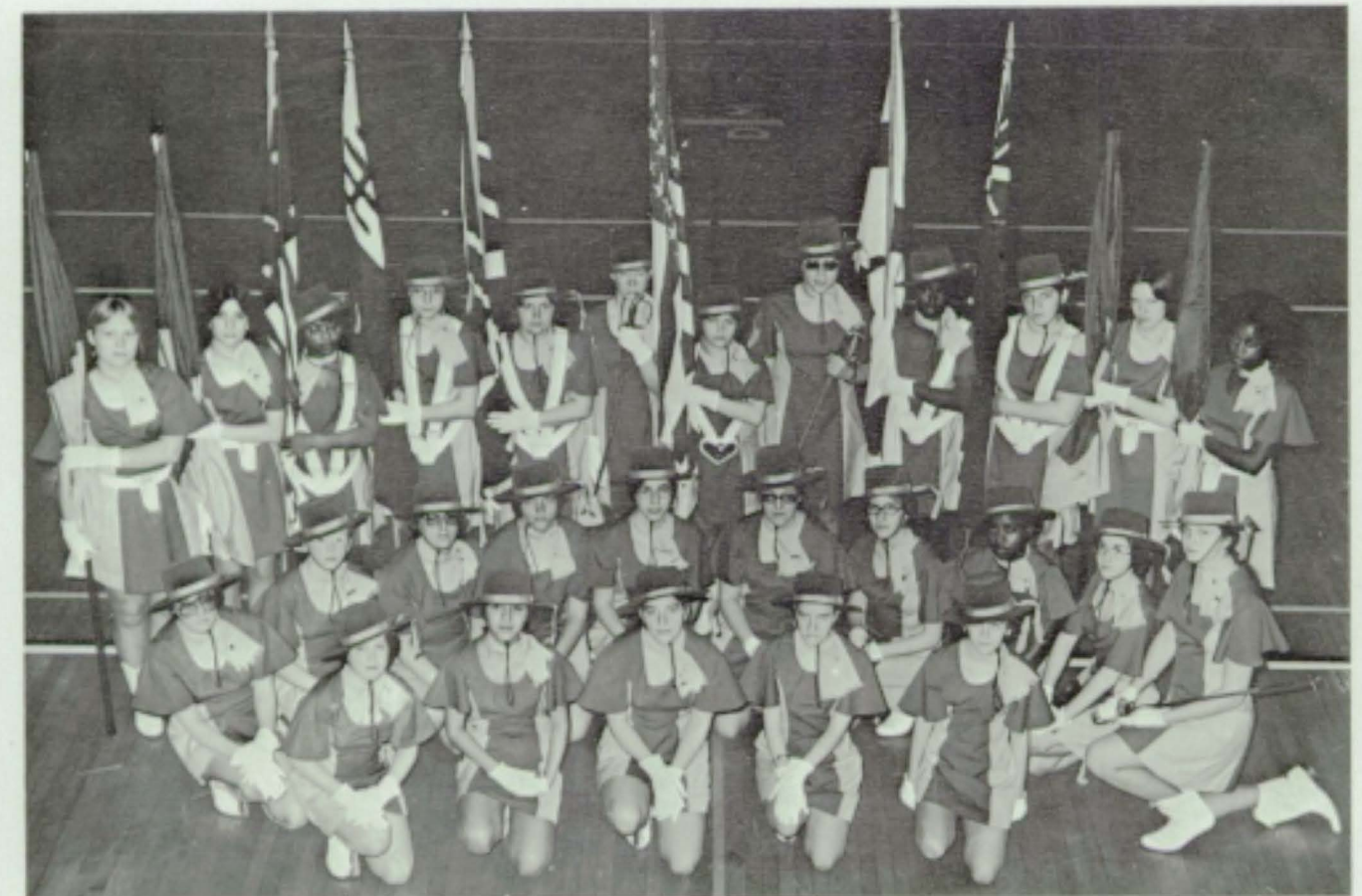

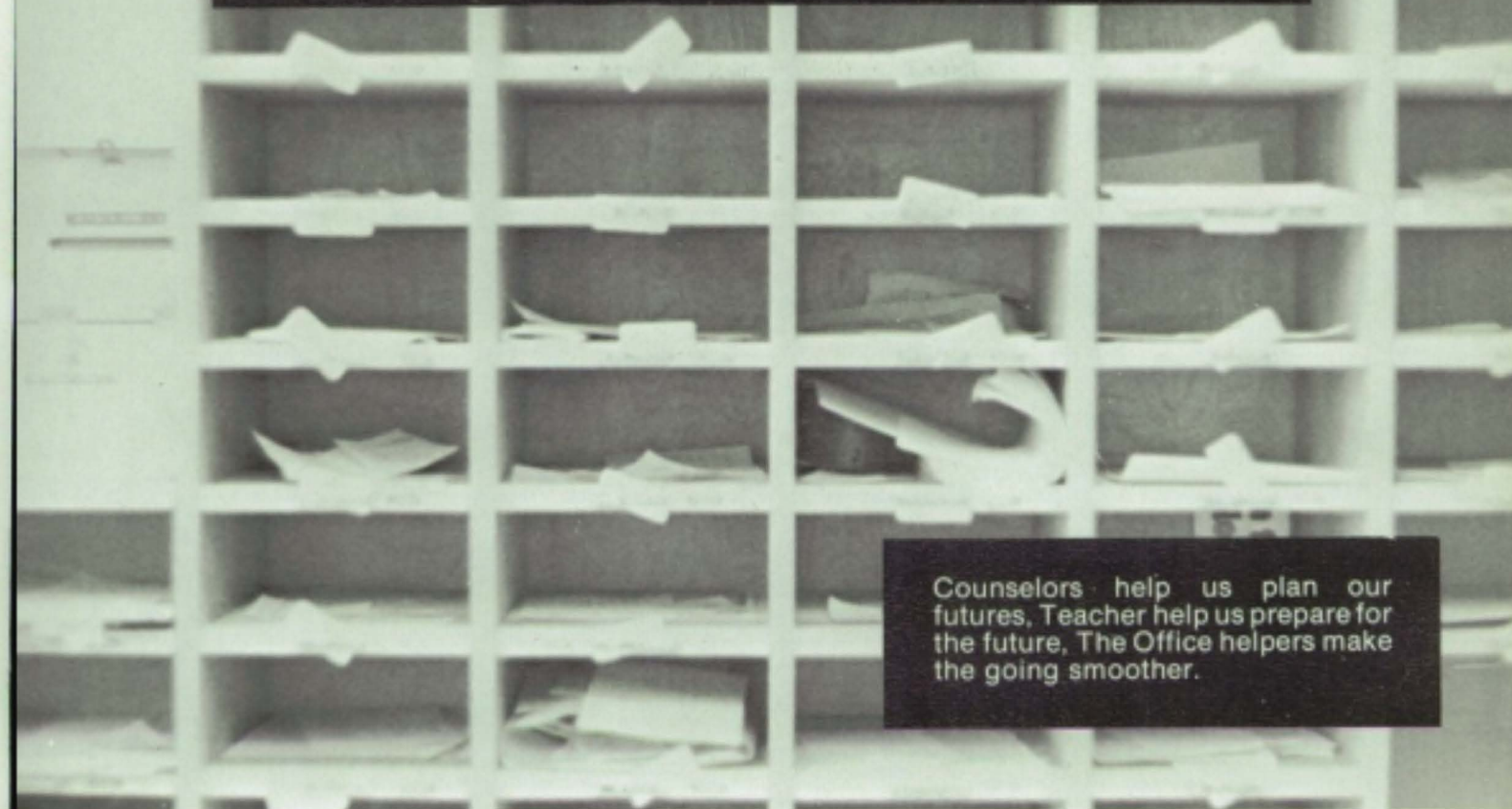
VICA

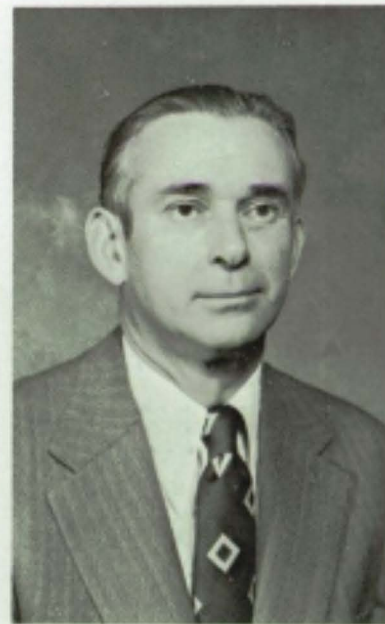

Mr. Blackman has great enthusiasm for Tech. He is ever so proud to raise the victory flag, tell of special awards and just be a part of this great school.



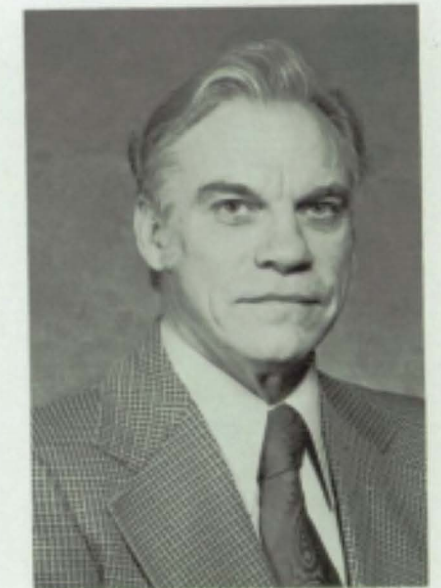

Areas of Study at Tech High

Agri-Business



Tech's agri-business core area is very busy throughout the school year growing different plants and raising livestock.

There are 39 Tech students sharing the 20 acres with 67 students from McCombs Jr. High. These students do 100% of the work and they pay for all of the livestock and other utilities they own by selling the vegetables grown in the summer.

The livestock consists of a furrow, three sows, 19 pigs, and a baby calf.

This year they're growing demonstration plots. They will consist of; strawberries, tulips, hard and soft wood trees, flowers of different types, mushrooms, and they are also raising bees.

As a new project, the agri-business area is growing a sample of Alaskan grass to see how it grows in Iowa.



Auto Body



Quality, workmanship, shop safety, good work habits, cooperation, dependability, and responsibility are stressed in the auto body core area.

The training includes welding, metal refinishing, spray painting, glass replacement, frame straightening, body panel alignment, and estimating.

This course is designed to operate in the same line of performance and workmanship as found in the better auto body shops in this area.



Auto Mechanics

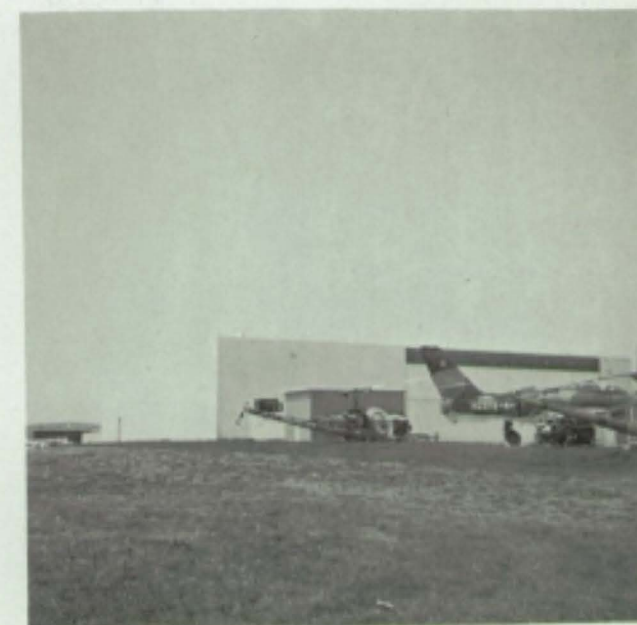


Tech's auto mechanics core area teaches job entry skills in the automotive field, and trade and quality craftsmanship.

This year, the auto mechanics core area has participated in the Plymouth Trouble Shooting contest and the V.I.C.A. contest.



Aviation



Tech's Aviation core area deals with airframe and power plant repair. These students are taught to service, repair, overhaul, and test aircraft airframes, engines, propellers, aircraft systems, electronic equipment, and aircraft instruments.

There has been better student attitude, and more student interest in aviation this year.

The aviation students have gone on a helicopter trip to Boone with the Army, and the Aero Club went to Washington, D.C.



Cabinet Making



Tech's cabinet making classes are taught machine operation, and the use of hand tools as some of its valuable skills.

The students design and build a piece of furniture of their own choice, as one of their many projects.

They also build all of the cabinets at the shop and install them in the Tech house.



Carpentry



The carpentry core area is now part of the building trades core area, along with cabinet making.

These students go through building trades, and spend one year where they cover a variety of things such as; use of tools, and an introduction to the aspects of carpentry.

During the second year, they specialize in cabinet making, and the third year they specialize in rough and trim carpentry and build the Tech house.

This year the carpentry class is putting the shingles on the sixth Tech house, and this house will be offered for sale by the time school is out this year.

Tech house, 1977, is number six in a row. The house was started October first with the help of several core areas.

From blue prints to landscaping is done by Tech students, under the supervision of Mr. Jim Hashman, carpentry core area teacher.

Unlike other years, the students tried to sell the house themselves instead of going through a realty agency.

The price was set after figuring the cost to build the house.

Clerical



Tech's clerical core area develops it's students office education and skills. These students take various courses related with the work done in offices.

Clerical students may belong to the OEA club, and may participate in local, regional and state conferences. Any winner will go to the National Leadership Conferences.

This year they have toured Central National Bank. In addition to touring the bank, these students visited the area where the bank was holding it's famous doll competition.



Commercial Art



This year the Commercial Art area has four art elective classes running simultaneously with the core area itself. The students in the elective classes are taught some techniques in drawing, lettering, etc. as those in the core area.

There are also two printing students taking Commercial Art for the art learning aspects they should know.



Electronic Communications



Tech's two classes of electronics share the same shop, but study and work with equipment pertaining to their particular areas.

The students in Communication Electronics study and learn to repair stereo equipment and black and white as well as color television sets.

Students who study Computer Electronics learn about computer logic circuits and elementary programming. This enables them to diagnose and repair faulty computers.



Computer Electronics



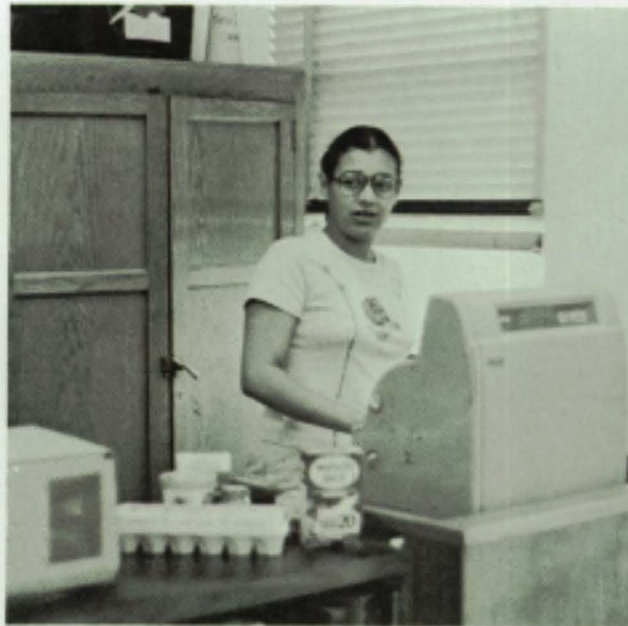
Diesel



The diesel area is concerned with the big motors, those that run on diesel gas. Motors used in heavy equipment are worked on by Tech students. Motors that have been donated by different firms are those that the students use to learn to repair.



Distributive Education



Distributive education offers training programs that prepare students for careers in a variety of marketing related businesses. These include retail, wholesale, and service occupations which range from supermarket cashier to service station manager, to department store buyer.

These students study advertising, salesmanship, merchandising, communication, economics, and many others.

Upon graduation from their program, the students are ready for immediate employment in an entry-level job, or they may go on to further their education in distribution, marketing, or business administration at a two or four year college or university.



Drafting



Drafters are vital to every phase of life.

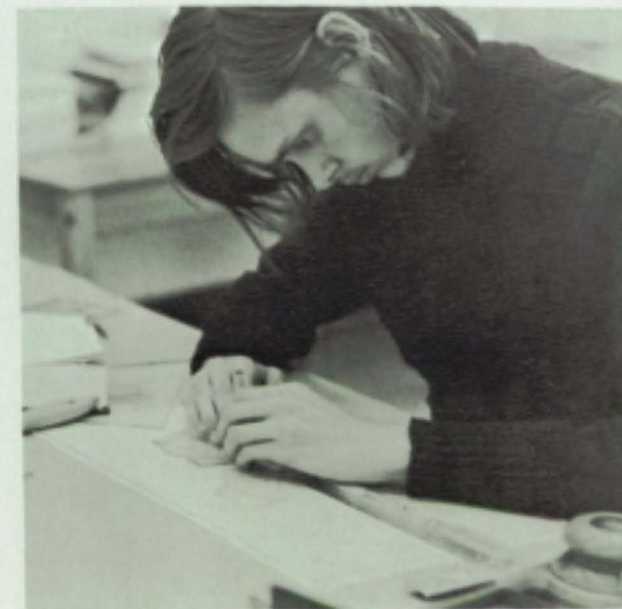
Tech has two drafting programs: Machine drafting and architectural drafting.

The machine drafter's chief responsibility is to make working plans, and detailed drawings for products to be manufactured.

The architectural drafter is employed by architectural firms, construction companies, public utilities, and federal, state, and local governments.

Tech has several students employed at various places such as those mentioned above.

The drafter has an excellent opportunity to exploit his creative ability, and to experience personal satisfaction by seeing his ideas materialize.



Computer Programming

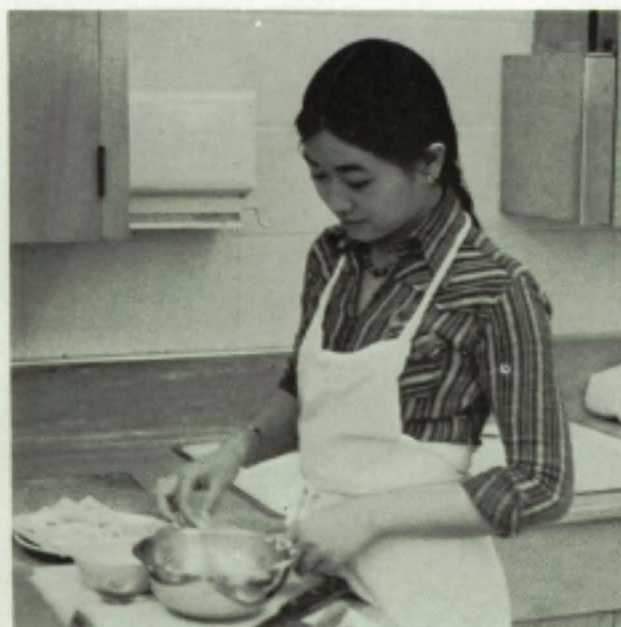


The computer programming core area deals in all phases of computer science and students have the best of equipment to work on. System analyzing and system designing is also part of the training taught.

Food Services



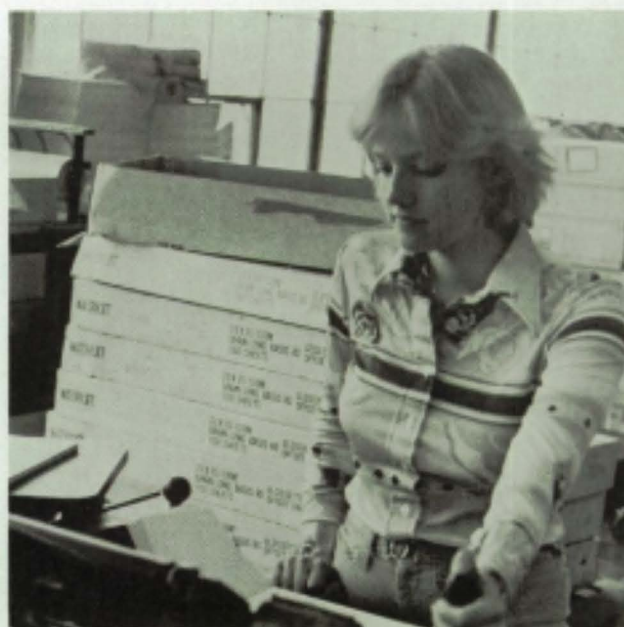
Tech's student run, T-room served a candlelight dinner to the Board of Education, and Administration, on the night of January 26, 1977.

Industrial electricity includes the study of such courses as basic electricity, electronics, static and rotating machinery, electric and electronic controls.



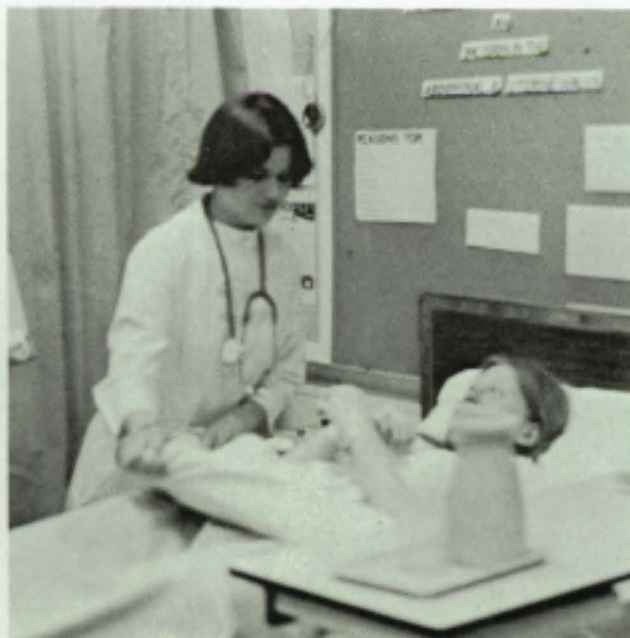
L.P.N. Science

Currently, some of these students are making wood turning, and metal cutting lathes as projects to develop their metal skills.



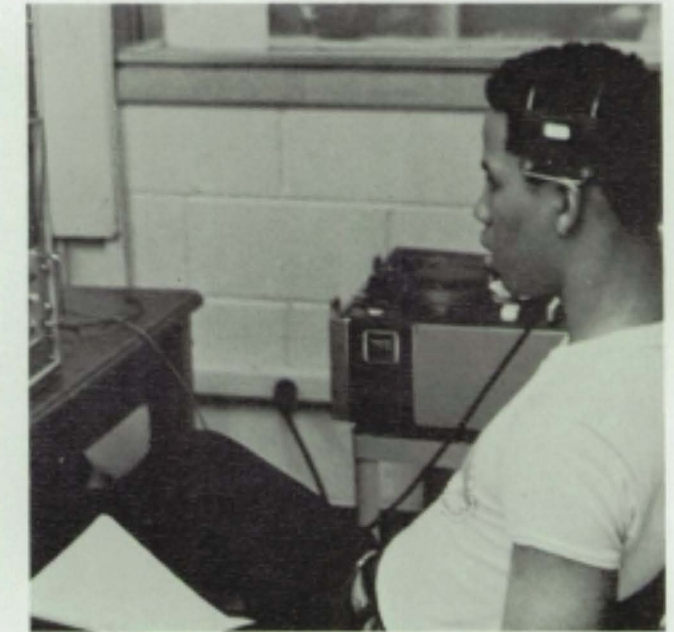
Painting and Decorating

Radio and T.V.



Tech's radio and T.V. core area deals in training the students in all phases of radio and television.

These phases include; disc jockey work on the air (DKPS-FM), preparation and production of special radio programs, public service announcements for the air and tapes — reel to reel, cartridge, cassette, and video. They also write, direct, and produce television programs, commercials, and video tape programs for members of the Tech staff.



Refrigeration



Tech's refrigeration core area trains students to service and install heating and air-conditioning equipment.

Since no two of the Tech houses are alike, it always provides a new and interesting experience for these students to install the heating and cooling systems.



Sheet Metal



This area is a five semester course in sheet metal pattern drafting, and shop work. Stressing safety, layout, cutting, bending and fastening, both in hand and machine processes.

The sheet metal program's training leads to a four year apprenticeship program in the field, of sheet metal heating and air conditioning duct work.



Steno



Shorthand, typing, secretarial training, and office training are a few skills students in Steno learn. These will help the students be placed in jobs after graduation.



Tailoring



Tech's tailoring students learn to make their own wearing attire, along with making and altering clothing for ROTC, and people outside of Tech.

The new industrial and blind stitch machines received by Tech this year have helped the students with their projects.

One of the projects of the tailoring area this year was doing display garments for Youngkers, downtown.



Welding

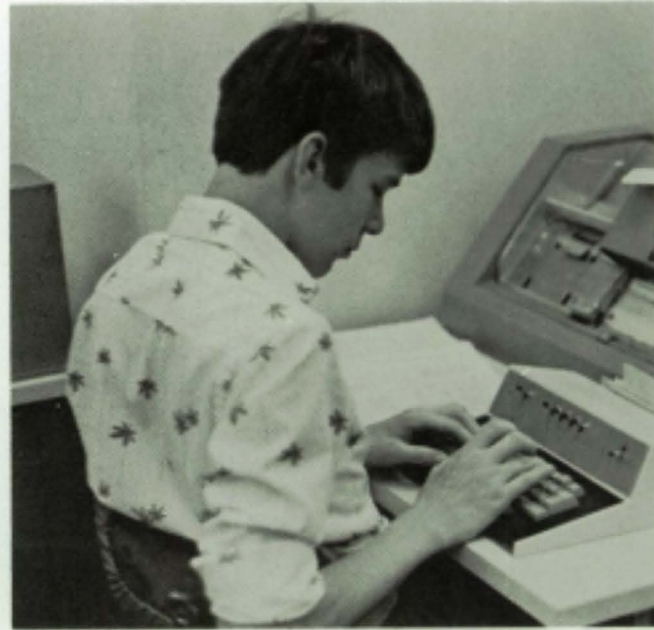


Tech's welding students are taught how to weld various metals and alloys with the most modern type welding machines.

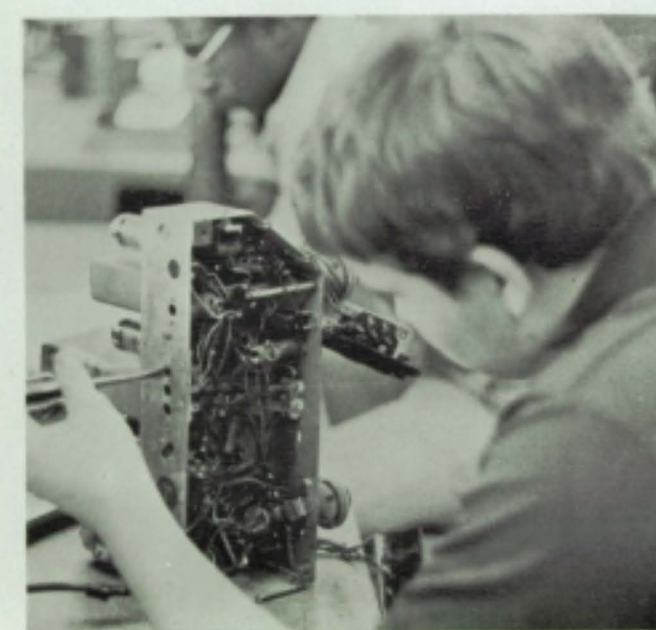

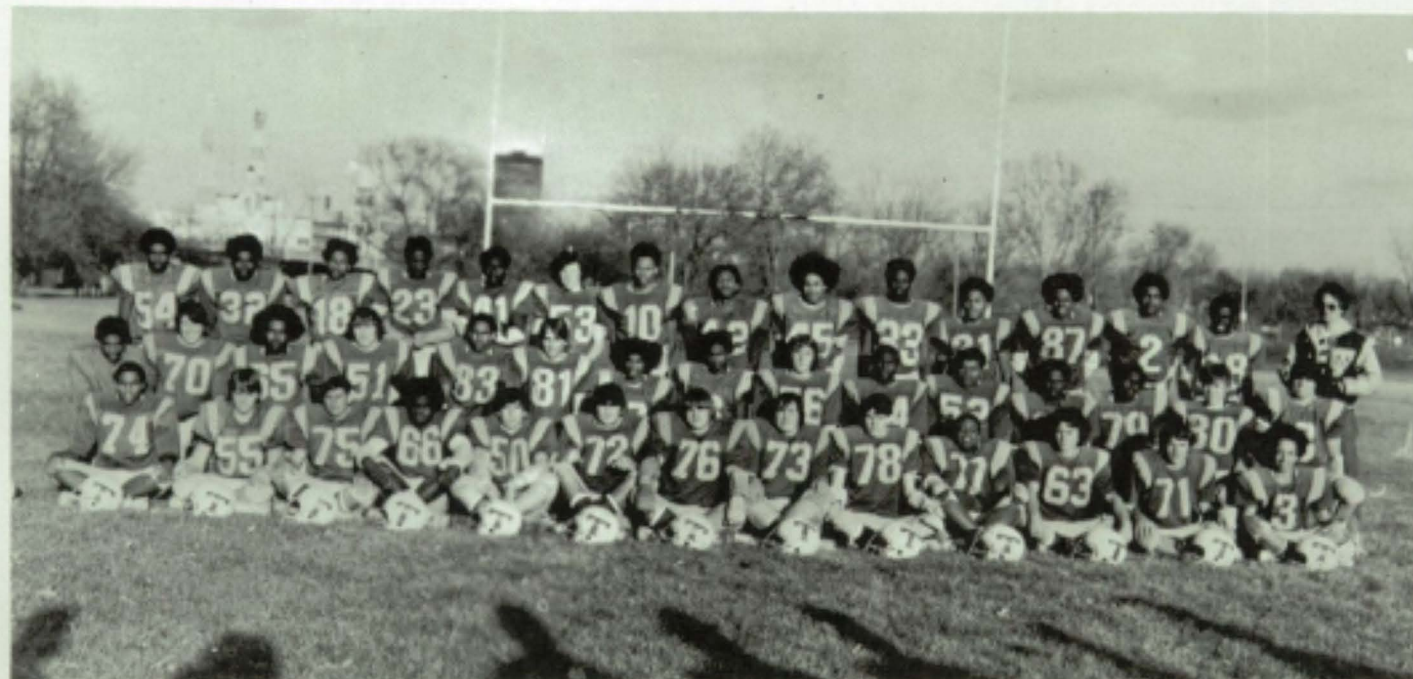

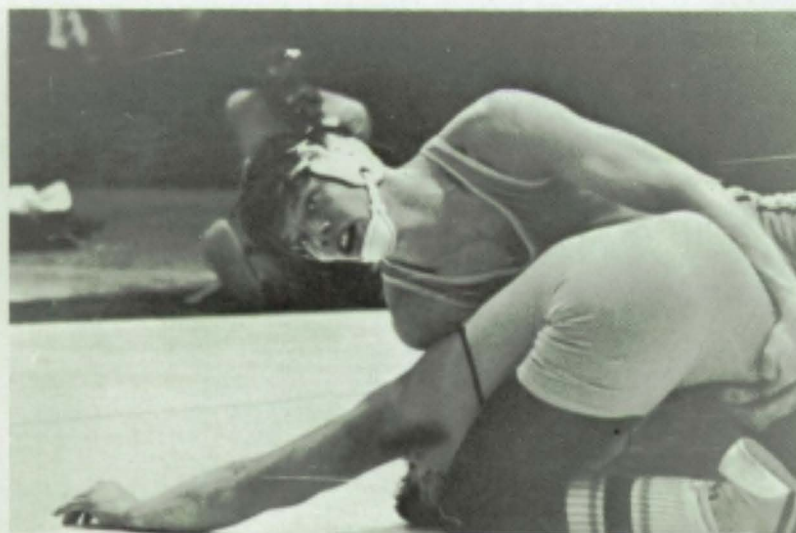

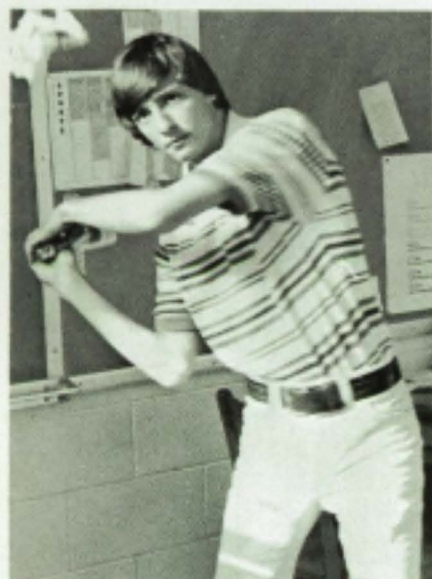

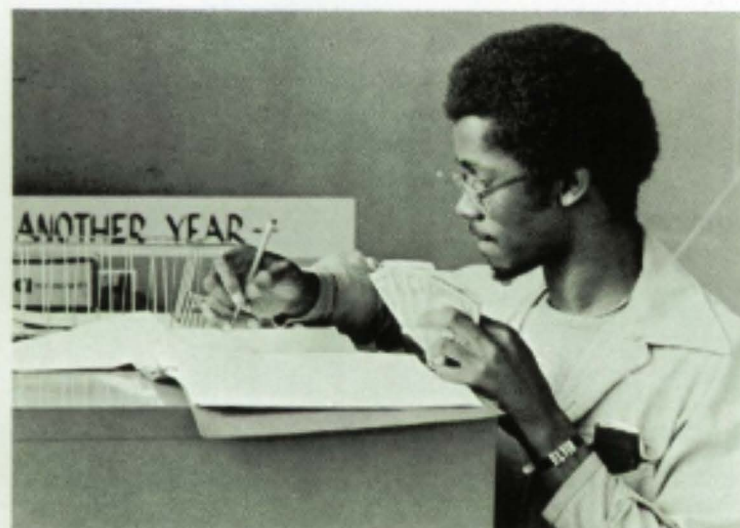
The 1977 Technician staff was kept busy with putting out nineteen issues, including the senior issue.

The Technician is completely put together at Tech. Stories are dug up, written, and typed by the journalism students, and printed in the Tech printing shop.



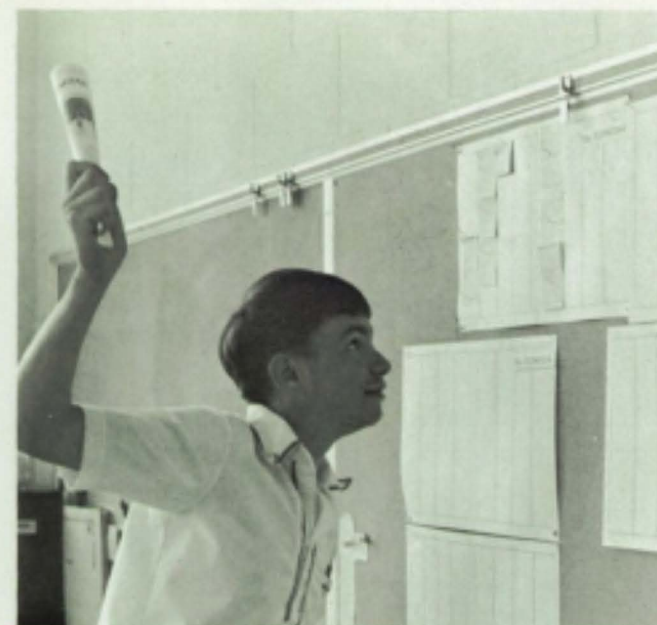

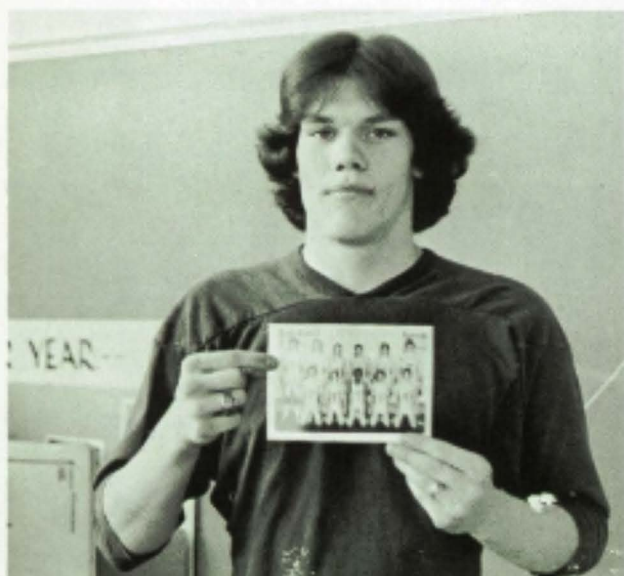

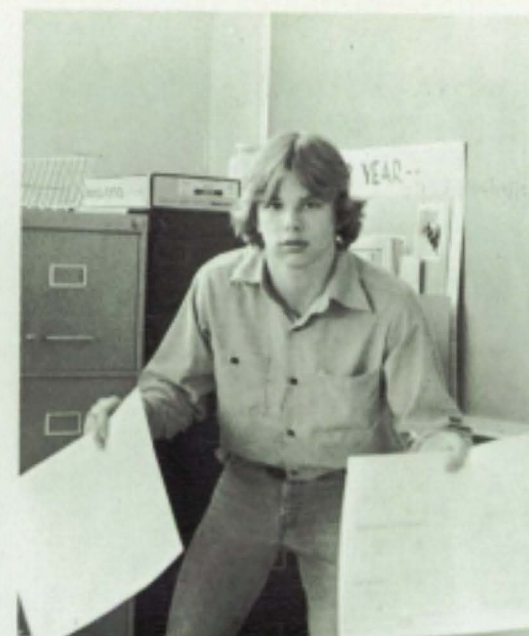
